The Recreation Office is located in the Municipal Office at 1310 Centre Line. The Smith - Ennismore - Lakefield Recreation Department is committed to the safe, clean, and responsible operation of our sports facilities, parks, and playgrounds.

Our facilities, parks, and playgrounds are inspected regularly. Please report any concerns to the Recreation Office at 705-292-9507 Ext. 243 or 241.

#### **Community Centres**

The Recreation Department maintains and operates the Ennismore Community Centre and the Lakefield-Smith Community Centre. These facilities provide for year round recreational activities, receptions, and service programs for the community.

#### **Outdoor Sports Facilities**

Our staff maintains the sports fields in Ennismore, Bridgenorth, and Lakefield to ensure the ball diamonds and soccer fields meet user needs and provide a constant level of quality.

#### **Lakefield Marina**

The Lakefield Marina, located at 1 Water Street, is operated and maintained by the Recreation Department. Our duty is to provide a high level of service to our customers and promote tourism in the area.

#### **Parks, Trails, and Beaches**

We care for our parks, natural areas and streetscapes to enhance the Township's image and provide recreational spaces for residents and visitors.

Our duties generally include grass cutting and trimming, beach preparation, tree planting, tree pruning and removal, flowerbed maintenance and watering, litter control, and repairs to fencing and outbuildings.

#### **Playground Equipment**

Our duty is to inspect and maintain our playground equipment in order to provide safe and long lasting play areas for our youth.

Our playground structures are designed to meet all safety requirements. The equipment is inspected regularly and a logbook is maintained to ensure that any defects are repaired immediately.

## **Reception and Meeting Facilities**

The Recreation Department maintains and operates the Bridgenorth Community Hall, the Ennismore Community Centre Auditorium, the Niels Pind Room in the Lakefield-Smith Community Centre, the Marshland Centre and the Centennial Room in Lakefield. These facilities provide for year round receptions, meetings and service programs for the community

## **Festivals**

Our festivals hosted by the Township receive assistance from the Recreation Department for set-up and tear down, erecting fences, and general maintenance during the events. We also provide administration assistance to the organizing committees to ensure that we operate successful events.

#### **Burritt Mann Memorial Park – 2048 Mud Road, Selwyn**

#### **Cenotaph Park – Lakefield**

Covering over 50 acres on the shores of Chemong Lake, this park has a beach and a large picnic area with a pavilion. #### **Ennismore Heritage Trail**

##### **Shade Shelter.**

Completed as a Millennium Bureau of Canada Project, the Trail leads to the interior of this large and beautiful park. Interpretive information points guide you through a variety of natural settings and regional points of interest. Features include two boardwalk sections, an osprey viewing platform, and an interior picnic area with pavilion.

#### **Jones Beach – 908 Jones Beach Road, Bridgenorth**

##### **Swimming**

This beach provides a swimming & picnic area for those hot summer days. It is also the location of the children’s swimming program run by the Chemung Lake District Lions Club.

#### **Isabel Morris Park – 20 Concession Street, Lakefield**

##### **Picnic Pavilion**

This Park is located adjacent to the Lakefield-Smith Arena and provides a view of the Lakefield waterfront and the Otonabee River. There is a pavilion, a picnic area and a playground. This park is the site of several community events including the Literary Festival and the Lakefield Jazz, Art & Craft Festival.
