The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield is the largest Township in the County of Peterborough and is situated in the heart of the Kawartha Lakes Region, bordered almost entirely by lakes. The Township is largely a rural community with three distinct urban centres, those being Lakefield, Bridgenorth, and Ennismore.

The County of Peterborough is known for its exceptional quality of life and beautiful setting in the Kawartha's tourism region. The area has a multitude of recreational opportunities, a diverse industrial, commercial and agricultural base, quality health care, and excellent schools - including two outstanding post-secondary institutions. Peterborough is just one hour from the Greater Toronto Area. Real estate is affordable and communities are safe.

With a population of approximately 135,000 (increases substantially in the summer season) the Greater Peterborough Area is the regional centre for East Central Ontario and draws from a market population of 350,000. The area's proximity to major markets in Canada and the northeastern United States, combined with an effective transportation System, that includes the Peterborough Municipal Airport which has the longest paved, lighted runway between Toronto and Ottawa, and four-lane access to the Greater Toronto Area, makes the area an unparalleled setting as a business location.

Among the many successful area-based businesses serving local, national, and international markets from Peterborough are: Pepsico Foods (Quaker), General Electric, FisherCast Global, Siemens Milltronics, Minute Maid, SGS Lakefield Research, Savage Arms; and Paluski Boats.

The Village of Lakefield is a small urban community of approximately 2,500 people located on the Otonabee River, part of the historic Trent Severn Waterway system, and south of Katchewanooka Lake. Lakefield is primarily a residential community with historic homes and heritage sites carefully combined with modern residential areas. Lakefield has a well defined central core and a small industrial base.

Lakefield offers many of the amenities of big city life, in a quaint small town setting. Future development opportunities exist to the east and south west of Lakefield, as plans are underway to develop these prime commercial/industrial/ residential areas.

The Hamlet of Bridgenorth is a small residential community situated on beautiful Chemong Lake amid a largely rural landscape. Bridgenorth offers a centralized destination for shopping and services, and meets the daily needs of residents and tourists. Bridgenorth has lands suitable for a variety of commercial developments.

The Hamlet of Ennismore is historically picturesque with the post office, general store, and community church centrally located as in days of old. Like Bridgenorth, the Hamlet of Ennismore is centered in a mainly rural area, and provides a focal point for community recreational and social events including hard and softball diamonds, soccer pitches, tennis and basketball courts, arena and curling rinks, and reception facilities. Chemong Lake, Buckhorn Lake, and Pigeon Lake border the Ennismore ward.

The Township boasts many local attractions and events that enhance the quality of life for residents and tourists alike. Thousands of tourists visit the Township each year to enjoy our beautiful lakes, parks, and recreation facilities, heritage and cultural sites, and events, shopping, restaurants, festivals, entertainment, and accommodation facilities. Activities include fishing, camping, snowmobiling, cross country skiing, boating, golfing, art galleries, nature trails, and much more.

Community spirit and enthusiasm is evident in the number of special events scheduled annually throughout the Township. These events are planned and operated largely by volunteers. Events include:

The Township is a neighbour to the Curve Lake First Nation, a community situated on a peninsula between Chemong and Buckhorn Lakes. Curve Lake hosts an annual Powwow and Arts and Craft Sale. It is also the home of the famous Whetung Ojibwa Art and Crafts Gallery.

The Township employs over 50 full time, part time and seasonal employees.

- ⇒ The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield is located in Central Ontario in the County of Peterborough.
- ⇒ The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield is approximately 100 km and 1 hour from the Greater Toronto Area.
- ⇒ The southeast portion of the Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield borders the City of Peterborough.
- ⇒ The eastern portion of the Township borders the Otonabee River and above Lakefield includes Lake Katchewanooka, Clear Lake and Stoney Lake.
- ⇒ The Township's northern border is formed by the shorelines of Pigeon, Buckhorn, Lower Buckhorn and Lovesick Lakes.

Transportation

A network of Township, County and Provincial roadways services the Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield.

Major Provincial highways that provide access to the Township include:

- ⇒ Highways 401 and 115 provide access to and from the Greater Toronto Area and other major centres in Southern Ontario.
- ⇒ Lindsay Road/County Road 1 (formerly Highway 7B) traverses the south western portion of the Township.
- ⇒ County Road 29 (formerly Provincial Highway 28) and County Road 23 (formerly Provincial Highway 507) provide access in a north-south direction.
- ⇒ Highway 28 (formerly Provincial Highway 134) goes South from County Road 29 to Highway 7
- ⇒ Highway 7 forms a portion of the western boundary.

The City of Peterborough operates a Municipal Airport providing regional flight service to the area. The airport has a 5000' lighted runway and published GPS approach, and no noise restrictions.

Toronto International Airport is 140 km or 90 miles away by major highway.

The Township is on major trucking routes.

The Trent Severn Waterway has been designated as a National Historic River System. It is serviced by a system of locks connecting Lake Ontario north to Georgian Bay. The Trent Severn Waterway passes through our Township, with locks at Young's Point, Buckhorn, Burleigh Falls and Lakefield.

Walking and Cycling Trail networks are located in Lakefield, Bridgenorth and Ennismore. The Lakefield Trail connects to the Trans-Canada Trail network.

Parks and Trails

There are **Numerous Parks** and **Trail Systems** in the Township. A Parks and Recreation Services Plan was completed in 2002.

- ***Cenotaph Park – Lakefield***
Centrally located at the Memorial Hall, this is an ideal resting area while shopping or enjoying the Lakefield Millennium trail. The flower gardens are provided and maintained by the Lakefield Horticultural Society.
- ***Chemong Park – Hatton Ave., Bridgenorth***
The park features several acres of tall pines overlooking Chemong Lake. It has a walking trail, a lookout, and historical information. A shore line restoration project was recently completed by the Otonabee Regional Conservation Authority.
- ***Ennismore Waterfront Park – Ennis Rd., Ennismore***
Covering 50 acres on the shores of Chemong Lake, the park includes a beach and large picnic area, complete with pavilion. The Ennismore Heritage Trail, described below, is a key feature of this area. The park is also the location of the Summer Day Camp, operated by the YMCA.
- ***Ennismore Heritage Trail – Ennismore Waterfront Park***
Completed as a Millennium Bureau of Canada project, the Trail leads to the interior of this large and beautiful park. Interpretive information points guide you through a variety of natural settings and regional points of interest. Features include two boardwalk sections, an osprey-viewing platform, and an interior picnic area with pavilion.
- ***Isabel Morris Park – Lakefield***
The Park is located adjacent to the Lakefield-Smith Arena, and provides a view of the Lakefield Waterfront and the Otonabee River. There is also a pavilion and a picnic area. This park is the site of several community events, including the Literary Festival and the Jazz & Art Festival.
- ***Jones Beach – Jones Beach Rd., Bridgenorth***

Licensing

The Clerk's Department is responsible for the issuance of marriage licenses, birth registrations, death registrations, lottery licenses, and Commissioner of Oath services in accordance with the guidelines set out by the Province of Ontario.

Fire Services and Community Emergency Preparedness

The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield Volunteer Fire Department serves more than 16,000 people over 155 square miles, including service by boat to water-access properties. The Department provides service out of 5 fire halls, with 90 personnel and over 20 pieces of various apparatus. Department services include:

Municipal Development Charges:

Purpose of Municipal Development Charges

The general purpose for which development charges are imposed by the Township is to assist in providing the infrastructure required by future development in the municipality by establishing a viable capital funding source to meet the Township's financial requirement.

The Council of the Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield passed By-Law Nos. 2003-105 (area specific charges applicable within the Lakefield South new development area) and 2003-106 (uniform Township-wide charges) on September 9, 2003 under subsection 2(1) of the *Development Charges Act, 1997*. Area-specific development charges are payable in addition to the township-wide charge.

Development Charges Rules

The rules for determining if a development charge is payable in a particular case, and for determining the amount of the charge, are as follows:

1. Development Charge By-Law No. 2003-106 applies to all lands in the Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield. Development Charge By-Law No. 2003-105 applies to all lands located within the Lakefield South new development area as defined in Schedule C to the By-Law.
2. Development charges are payable prior to issuance of a Building Permit under By-Law No. 2003-106 (uniform charges), and upon registration of a plan of subdivision under By-Law 2003-105 (Lakefield South area-specific charges). (An exception has been provided for Lakefield South Phase 1A lands, such that charges are payable prior to issuance of a Building Permit).
3. The following uses are wholly exempt from development charges under both By-Laws:
 - lands owned by and used for the purpose of a municipality, local board thereof, or board of education;
 - the addition of one or two additional dwelling units to an existing structure;
 - the enlargement of the gross floor area of an existing industrial building by 50% or less;
 - a public hospital under the *Public Hospitals Act*;
 - non-residential land uses.
4. A credit against development charges will be provided under By-Law No. 2003-106 (uniform charges) where development or redevelopment does not result in the creation of an additional dwelling unit in comparison with the land at any time during the previous five years.
5. The Schedule of development charges will be adjusted annually as of September 10th each year, in accordance with the most recent twelve month change in the Statistics Canada Quarterly, "Construction Price Statistics".

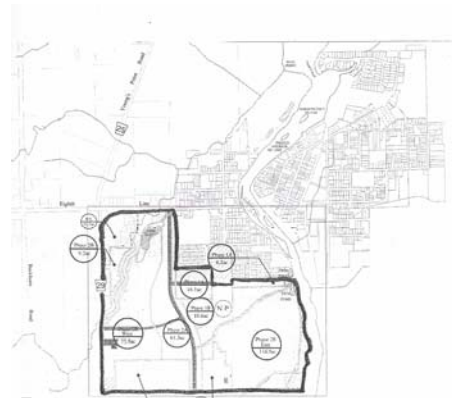

County of Peterborough Development Charge - By-law No. 2007-38

Purpose of County Development Charges

The County of Peterborough passed Development Charge By-law No. 2007-38 on the 16th Day of May, 2007 under Section 2 of the Development Charges Act, 1997.

New development charges imposed under the by-law are required to pay for the increased capital costs related to the increased need for County services arising from development.

This By-law applies to all lands in the geographic area of the County, whether or not the land is exempt from taxation under the Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.A.31, as amended.

Development charges shall be imposed for the following categories of services (refer to Schedule A) to pay for the increased capital costs required because of increased needs for services arising from development:

- (1) Long Term Care;
- (2) County-City Health Unit;
- (3) Emergency Medical Services;
- (4) General Government;
- (5) Roads and Related Works.

Development charges shall be imposed against all lands, buildings or structures within the area to which this By-law applies if the development of such lands, buildings or structures requires any of the following approvals:

- (1) the passing of a zoning by-law or of an amendment to a zoning by-law under Section 34 of the Planning Act;
- (2) the approval of a minor variance under Section 45 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. C.26, as amended, or Section 9 of the Condominium Act, 1998, S. O. 1998, C. 19, as amended, or its predecessor Act;
- (3) a conveyance of land to which a by-law passed under Subsection 50(7) of the Planning Act applies;
- (4) the approval of a plan of subdivision under Section 51 of the Planning Act;
- (5) a consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act;
- (6) the approval of a description under Section 50 of the Condominium Act; or
- (7) the issuing of a permit under the Building Code Act, 1992 in relation to a building or structure.

Economic Development

Through Township specific initiatives, and in partnership with the Greater Peterborough Area Economic Development Corporation (GPAEDC) and other stakeholders, municipal staff explore opportunities for sound, sustainable economic development. The Township adopted an Economic Strategy in 2002. Business Retention and Expansion programs, high speed internet initiatives, and support for tourism are some of the key areas to which the Township directs its resources.

Strategic Studies Completed:

The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield is positioning itself for the future with the adoption of a number of key development tools including a Library Services Study, Parks and Recreation Study, Roads Needs Study and the completion of an Economic Development Strategy 2002-2012, all of which were completed in 2002. A Development Charges Study was completed in early 2003. The Township is working toward the adoption of a new consolidated Official Plan and Zoning By-law. These documents will steer the Township's future services, growth and development.

The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield's Strategic Plan, was approved by Council in 2007. The Plan outlines a number of the challenges that are facing the Township, while providing a guide to Council's priorities and actions that are required to reach our goals and achieve our vision for 2012. It is intended to build on the high level of services that are already provided by the Township while positioning the Township for an even stronger future.

Development Lands:

The Township of Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield has undertaken a Secondary Plan Study for approximately 350 acres in the municipality to examine the opportunities for urban serviced residential, commercial and/or industrial development in the Lakefield South area. The lands in Lakefield South are currently outside of the existing Urban Service Area and required a re-designation for urban land uses in the Township Official Plan in order to permit development. As such, a Scoped Watershed Study, a Servicing Study, a Traffic Impact Study, and a Planning Justification Report were completed. Furthermore, a Secondary Plan/Official Plan Amendment prepared these lands to fast-track development applications to facilitate plans of subdivision and zoning approvals in the future.
